

CHARACTERS in *The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (abridged) [revised]*

In performance, the actors should substitute their own names for “Adam,” “Jess,” and “Daniel.” Where Shakespearean characters appear in the script, the character name is preceded by the actor’s initial: i.e., A/JULIET means Adam is playing Juliet, D/ROMEO means Daniel is playing Romeo, J/HAMLET means Jess is playing Hamlet, etc.
